Visitors to the 12th Annual Ottawa Wine and Food Show in early November got a special treat - a wide array of Ukrainian vodkas and sparkling wines trying to find their way to Canadian liquor shelves. UCAN Victory Ltd., the Ottawa-based distributor, wowed the connaisseurs and amateurs alike with three varieties of vodka - Old Kiev, Golded Gate, and Kniazyi Kelych - whose smooth taste had visitors coming back for more. But what surprised most people was the sparkling wine, in particular a red semi-sweet number.

"We never even knew they grew grapes in Ukraine!" commented one impressed taster. That's fair, given that Ukrainians don't know that we grow grapes here in Canada either. What Ukraine lacks in North American marketing savvy and expertise, it makes up for in quality, experience, and tradition. Germans, Austrians, Swiss, Dutch and other European wine connaiseurs have been savoring these Ukrainian wines from the Artiomivskiy Zavod in Donetsk for decades.
