





UKRAINE'S MINISTERS AND DM'S IN CANADA ON EXECUTIVE PROGRAM

EXECUTIVE PROGRAM

The Canadian Centre for Management Development (CCMD), the Canadian Bureau for International Education (CBIE) and U*CAN Ukraine Canada Relations Inc. are delivering the second component of a three-year, \$4.5 million project to support the Institute of Public Administration and Local Government (IPALG) in Kyiv, Ukraine. It is managed by CBIE and financed by the Bureau of Assistance for Central And Eastern Europe at the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade.

A delegation of 20 senior ministers and deputy ministers is scheduled to arrive on October 16 for a two-week development program to be held in Ottawa and Toronto. The group will participate in a program of lectures, visits to their counterpart departments, and meetings with Canadian business leaders. Last December, a similar group of top Ukrainian public servants spent two weeks in Canada.

Among the Senior Executives coming to Canada will be the Ministers of Finance and Security, Deputy Heads of Ukraine's Cabinet of Ministers, Justice, Foreign Relations and State Property Fund, the Regional Head of Donetsk oblast, and the mayors of Kyiv and Lviv,

WOMEN'S EXECUTIVE PROGRAM

In November, Ottawa will see a group of six women from Ukraine hosted by the CCMD on a two-week Women's Executive Program. While in the Former Soviet Union employment opportunities for women were equal to those for men in blue collar jobs and for manual labour, that was where the equality ended. Today, the lack of women in Ukraine in middle-management positions (not to even mention upper-management positions) is a legacy of that system. The women have been chosen from among the graduates of IPALG, which has as its mandate the challenge of public administration training in Ukraine. The women are middle-level executives, and the approach being takes by CCMD in the Canadian portion of this leadership program is to "train the trainers". This program will come on the heels of the visit to the Canadian capital by a delegation of Ukrainian Ministers and Deputy Ministers who will also be spending some time at CCMD.
